

HMO/PXS/MXS Clinical Notification Trigger List

Below are guidelines recommended for medical management staff to notify Summit ReSources of potentially catastrophic cases.

NOTIFICATION TRIGGERS:

High cost pharmacy (e.g. Sovaldi, Olysio, Factor VIII, Cerezyme, Flolan, Cinryze, Yervoy, Angiomax) and any drug over \$10,000/month paid.

Example ICD-10 codes: B18.2, D66, D84.1, 75, E77, I26.01-I26.02, I26.09, I27.0, I27.2, I27.89

Major burns, trauma with a potential for a prolonged hospitalization and/or acute rehabilitation

Example ICD-10 codes: T20-T22, T24, T31-T32

ESRD/dialysis with monthly dialysis costs greater than \$10,000

Example ICD-10 codes: Z49, Z76.89

Transplants, complex oncology, severe cardiomyopathy, ECMO, and ventricular assist device insertion

Premature infants with one or more of the following:

- Gestational age \leq 24weeks; ICD-10 code: P07.20-P07.23
- Severe congenital heart disease (e.g. Tetralogy de Fallot, hypoplastic left heart, etc.)
Example ICD-10 codes: Q21.3, Q22, Q23.4, Q23.8, Q24.8
- Severe gastrointestinal anomalies (e.g. short bowel syndrome, necrotizing enterocolitis, gastroschisis, omphalocele, etc); Example ICD-10 codes: K91.2, P76.8-P76.9, P77, P78-P78.1, Q79.5
- Severe bronchopulmonary dysplasia requiring long term ventilator treatment;
Example ICD-10: P27.1, P27.8

Cases which have one or more of the following:

- Out of network services with minimal or no negotiated discounts
- Billed charges that greatly exceed reasonable and customary for the services rendered – refer BEFORE the claim is paid
- Questionable charges (such as unbundling, experimental treatments, etc.)
- Cases that have the potential to exceed the reinsurance deductible
